As a result of The 2015 702 Sun International CEO SleepOut™, R26.4 million was awarded to Girls and Boys Town from private South Africa and corporate leaders who participated in the event.

The funds were used in the development of 6 Legacy Projects, aligned to Girls and Boys Town SHINE™ Goals – which benefit children and families helped through Girls and Boys Town but also impact on the society in multiple and sustainable ways.

TIER 2: COMMUNITY-BASED FAMILY WORK

Girls and Boys Town out-of-office family workers support and strengthen vulnerable and at-risk youth and families in their own homes and communities, to develop sustainable family independence.

HOME SCHOOLING

Ongoing: 2016 – 2017



R1 700 000

used to fund a Home Schooling Process, helping youth to transition into independent studies and mainstream schooling.

The Home Schooling Process transitions youth through 5 stages:

100% Home Schooling ▶ 80% ▶ 50% ▶ 20% ▶ Independent Studies.

The programme has allowed Girls and Boys Town to work with youths more effectively and flexibly as they adjust and learn to conduct themselves appropriately within the more formal educational system.
